

St. John's Classical Academy School Health Rooms and Medication Guidelines 2025-2026 Over-The-Counter Medication Guidelines

- Parents/Guardians are encouraged to administer medications at home prior to or after school hours. SJCA does not keep stock oral medicine in the health room/clinic.
- To help ensure the health and safety of your scholar, St. Johns Classical Academy personnel are not permitted to dispense medication to a scholar without prior written authorization from a parent/guardian. Parent/guardians are required to complete a "Parental Authorization for Administration of Medication" (PAAM) form for all over-the-counter (OTC) medication. Without the required authorization paperwork, the scholar will not be given medication during school hours. Cough Drops, Tums, Midol, Eye Drops, & Topical Creams/Lotions/Ointments are all considered medications.
- OTC medication is intended to be given on an as needed basis (PRN). Therefore, OTC medications will
 only be given consecutively for seven days, after which a doctor's order will be required to continue to
 administer.
- All medication must be delivered to school by a *parent/guardian, not by the scholar,* in the original container, be age appropriate, unopened, unexpired, and be labeled with the scholar's name.
- OTC Medication will be given per label and cannot exceed the dose specified on the packaging label.
 Please check before bringing it to school; know the side effects.
- OTC medications for headaches must be FDA approved for such and need to have the PAAM filled out by a parent/guardian, the medication and form should be presented to the school nurse, she will make a copy of the form for the scholar to carry with the medication. Elementary and Middle School scholar's medication will be kept in the health room clinic.
- Before leaving medications at school, all medications must be counted, verified and documented by the parent/guardian and staff member.
- Each scholar (including siblings) receiving medication should have their own supply of medication, a separate PAAM, and is valid for the current school year in which it is completed.
- Medications will not be transported / accepted between home and school on a daily basis.
- ChapStick / Sunscreen may be carried with no PAAM.
- No medication containing Aspirin will be accepted without a physician's written order, due to the association with Reye Syndrome.
- Only FDA approved medicines will be accepted. No vitamins, nutritional supplements, etc.
- AT the end of the school year, parent/guardian will pick up any unused medication by the last day of school; otherwise, the school will dispose of the medication. Expired medication should be picked up within two (2) weeks of expiration date or it will be discarded.
